Reading	Listening to stories	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Listen to a range of stories including fiction and some non-fiction books on springtime/space or other interests• Free website links to books to read online: https://www.oxfordowl.co.uk/for-home/ https://www.storylineonline.net/ https://www.bbc.co.uk/iplayer/episodes/b00jdlm2/cbeebies-bedtime-stories• If you visit YouTube and search for 'Oxbridge Baby' they have all the traditional tales available with an illustrated video.
Writing	Writing sentences phonetically.	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Write your own version of a traditional tale. Children have done this with 'Little Red Hen' creating stories such as 'The Big Green Hen'• Ideas include using The Three Little Pigs as a story to start and learning to tell the story. After that children can swap main characters and retell the story slightly differently e.g. The Three Little Unicorns!• Let them have fun telling you their stories before you write it with them. Record them doing this and upload it onto Tapestry to share this with us!• They could use some folded paper to make their own books with illustrations. Record them doing this and upload it onto Tapestry to share this with us!• Find some facts about space and write these down.• When writing they should write using their phonics as best as they can e.g. encourage the children to say the sounds as they write down their words. Let your child attempt to spell words independently before giving help.
Communication and Language	Speaking, listening and having conversations	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage your child to have a conversation with you several times a day. You could talk about a story, a favourite day out or something your child is interested in. Encourage and model good use of language and sentence construction, remodelling their sentences correctly where necessary. E.g. "I goed to park!" Maths	Number recognition Counting Addition Subtraction Shapes	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Mathletics • Practice counting forwards and backwards to 20 • Writing numbers 1-20 in order - check formation is correct. • Counting objects around the house to 20. • Adding two single digit numbers so the answer is no more than 10 e.g. $4 + 6 = 10$ • Subtracting two single digit numbers so the answer is 10 or less e.g. $10 - 3 = 7$ • Shape hunt for 2D and 3D shapes including, sphere, cylinder, cube and cuboid. • Free websites http://www.snappymaths.com/ https://www.topmarks.co.uk/maths-games
