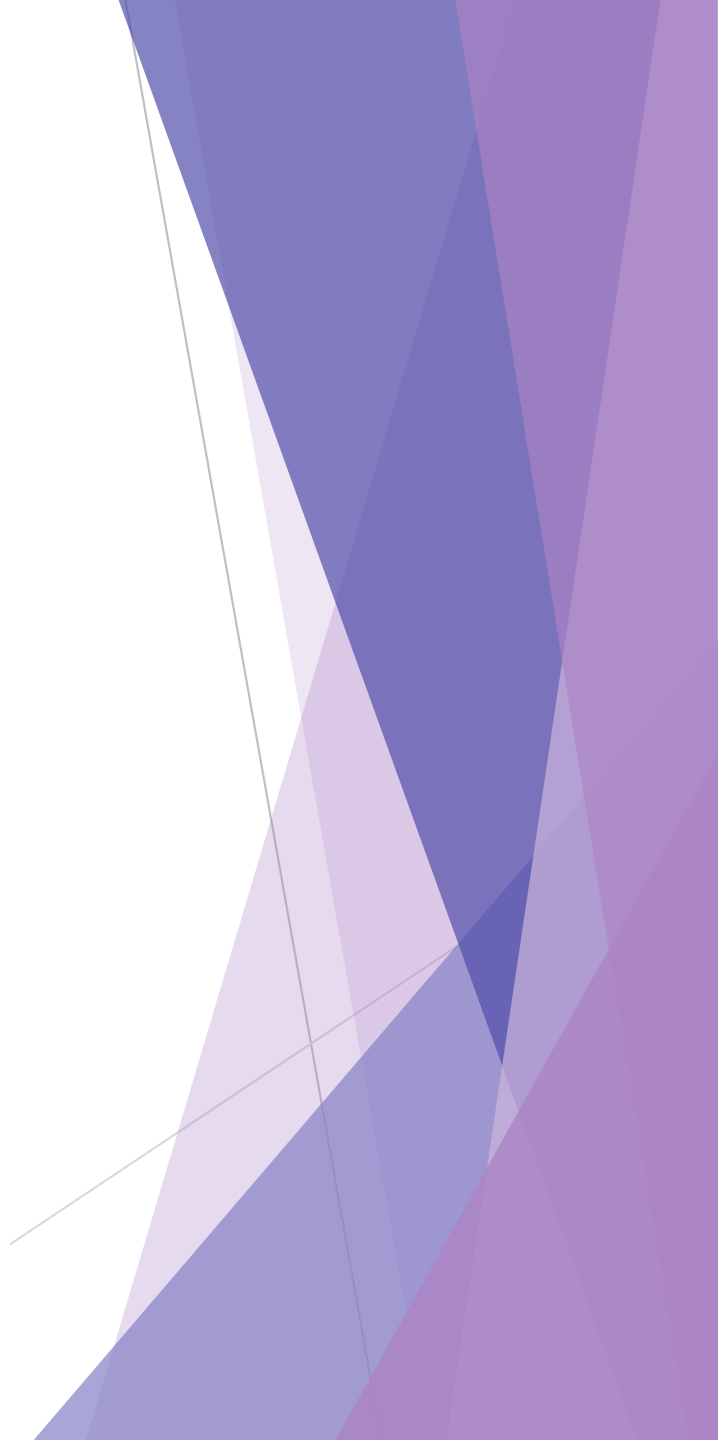


Mathematics



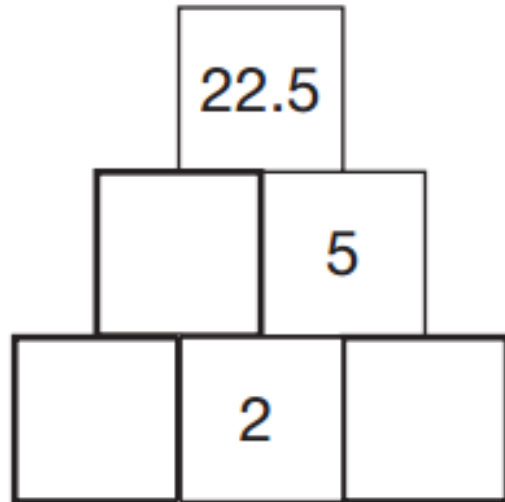

Sample Question - and answer

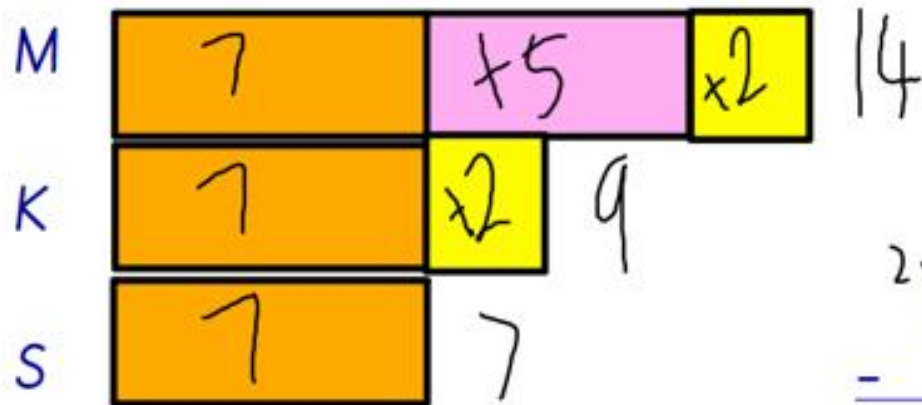
Mina has 5 more marbles than Kirsty.

$$21 \div 3 = 7$$

Scaled Scores

- ▶ 100 will always represent the 'national standard'.
- ▶ Each pupil's raw test score will therefore be converted into a score on the scale, either at, above or below 100.
- ▶ The scale will have a lower end point somewhere below 100 and an upper end point above 100.
- ▶ A child who achieves the 'national standard' (a score of 100) will be judged to have demonstrated sufficient knowledge in the areas assessed by the tests.
- ▶ In July each pupil will receive:
 - A raw score (number of raw marks awarded).
 - A scaled score in each tested subject.
 - Confirmation of whether or not they attained the national standard.

Maths Previous Scaled Scores

2017

- ▶ Pass Mark: 57
- ▶ GD: 95 (*scaled score of 110*)

2018

- ▶ Pass Mark: 61
- ▶ GD: 96 (*scaled score of 110*)

2023

- ▶ Pass Mark: 61
- ▶ GD: 96 (*scaled score of 110*)

Reading Previous Scaled Scores

2017

- ▶ Pass Mark: 26
- ▶ GD: 39 (*scaled score of 110*)

2018

- ▶ Pass Mark: 28
- ▶ GD: 40 (*scaled score of 110*)

2023

- ▶ Pass Mark: 24
- ▶ GD: 38 (*scaled score of 110*)

GPS Previous Scaled Scores

- ▶ Pass Mark: 36
- ▶ GD: 56 (*scaled score of 110*)

2018

- ▶ Pass Mark: 38
- ▶ GD: 56 (*scaled score of 110*)

2023

- ▶ Pass Mark: 36
- ▶ GD: 55 (*scaled score of 110*)

Supporting your child

- ▶ Ensure your child reads every night.
- ▶ Discuss vocabulary.
- ▶ Support with their homework
- ▶ Help them with the different skills of reading especially 'skim' reading where they are looking for key words in the text.
- ▶ Spellings – give different words and encourage syllabifying words.
- ▶ Check multiplication tables regularly.
- ▶ Purchase CPG books
